

Associate of Arts in Criminal Justice

UVI's Associate of Applied Science degree in Criminal Justice presents the major components of the American criminal justice system. It includes criminal behavior patterns, law enforcement organizations, juvenile systems, legal principles and doctrines and fundamentals of criminal investigations. Bachelor of Arts in Criminal Justice

The BA in Criminal Justice prepares students for the many careers in criminal justice and law enforcement and lays the academic foundation for post graduate education and law school. The program covers the study of law enforcement and security procedures, courts and corrections, and criminal justice theory.

This degree will teach students the functions of criminal justice organizations and law enforcement procedures. Upon graduation, a student will have the knowledge necessary to begin a rewarding career in the field. This program is also designed to qualify those students who are already in the criminal justice and law enforcement fields for promotion to advanced positions.

All requirements for the degree can be completed on either campus and some requirements can be completed online. Entry level courses can be completed on either campus and online.



Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice

The BS in Criminal Justice is an interdisciplinary program that prepares students for the many careers in criminal justice and law enforcement; This degree will teach students the functions of criminal justice organizations and law enforcement procedures. The BS degree differs from the BA because of its emphasis on the institutions of criminal justice, specifically the police, courts and corrections, forensic science, and crime scene investigations (CSI).

This program is also designed to qualify those students who are already in the criminal justice and law enforcement fields for promotion to advanced positions. Upon graduation, a student will have the knowledge necessary to begin a rewarding career in the field.

All requirements for the degree can be completed on either campus and some requirements can be completed online. Entry level courses can be completed on either campus and online.
