Bartlette is UVI's Longest-Serving Employee

Inez Bartlette has been employed at the University of the Virgin Islands since the fledgling institution was just six years old. This year the purchasing technician set a record, becoming the longest-serving employee in the history of UVI for her 40 years of service to the University.

To say that Bartlette has grown with the University is an understatement. Bartlette began her career at UVI as a student worker when she was just a teenager. Her first full-time employment was as a clerk typist in the Accounting Department.

who don't like me that much, it doesn't really matter – I gave UVI 40 years," Bartlette said in emotion-filled remarks. Bartlette has served under all of UVI's five presidents and said she is pleased with the institution's growth. "As I leave the University I would like to see us return to the days of camaraderie, the days where we had everyone looking out for each other," she said. "It's not the St. Thomas campus. It's a UVI family," she said.
