UVI Promotes Security Officers, Honors Them at First-Time Ceremony

In the first-ever Security Department Promotion Ceremony, members of UVI's St. Thomas campus Security Department were recognized for their promotion to the ranks of captain and sergeant. UVI administrators and staff, family and friends, joined the promotees at the ceremony held July 31, at the St. Thomas campus Sports and Fitness Center.

"Ladies and gentlemen, you should know this is history. In the years I have been here, this is a first," Captain John Payne said, opening the ceremony. He assured the UVI community that members of the security team will serve at the highest level.

UVI President Dr. LaVerne E. Ragster said that there are challenges in securing open campuses across the nation, including UVI's two campuses. The University and the mem-

bers of the Security Departments must meet those challenges, she said. "We've been given the responsibility of taking care of people's children, their spouses, sisters, brothers and loved ones," Dr. Ragster said. "I support what you do," she added. "Each and every one of you has my appreciation."

curity officer have increased, said UVI Chief of Security Elvin Fahie. "We who are charged with keeping you safe must work even harder," he said. While most people are asleep, Chief Fahie said he is busy thinking of ways to keep the campuses safe.

UVI Provost Dr. A.I. Musah recalled a time when a security officer alerted him around 11 p.m. one night that the windows of his vehicle were down. As students and staff go about their work at UVI, security keeps watch, he said. "Some-

body is watching over us. That somebody is our UVI security," Dr. Musah said. "We are here today to recognize the service and the excellence of that service."
