

Areas of Emphasis

- Shared Governance Model: Illustrates the means through which authority and responsibility are assigned, delegated, and shared in a climate of mutual support and respect.
- ➤ Shared Governance Matrix: Defines and clarifies the representative roles and responsibilities of decision-makers in various types of decisions at UVI.
 - ➤ Principles of Shared Governance: The guiding tenets that underpin the University's efforts to fully realize its stated mission and goals in the most effective and efficient manner.

UVI PROPOSED SHARED GOVERNANCE MODEL 05/08/08

This proposed model for shared governance at UVI is a modified version of the previous two diagrams based on additional input from University stakeholder groups. Arrows indicate decision making responsibilities and communication flow. The Senate shall consist of four representatives from each of the three University groups in addition to the president and cabinets
